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Dear Harry:

I appreciate the opportunity to give you my views on what has to be done to reverse the trend of events threatening our civilization.

Let me start with the following remarks:

1. It is not enough to identify a grave situation. If nothing is done about it, conditions remain unchanged or worsen.

2. It is not enough to tell the world what has to be done. Your newsletter has been of extreme value to persons wishing to preserve and increase their financial resources. However, if Western civilization perishes, your readers, as well as you and I, will perish with it. It is not enough to tell the passengers of the sinking Titanic where one can find the highest point on the ship. Such advice results, at best, only in a slight prolongation of the lives of the passengers.

3. Great men accomplish great deeds. Don't expect for someone else to initiate and pursue the program that I will outline here, and which I hope you will agree with. I know you are very busy. So am I. Considering what the stakes are, you and I must find the time to do what is necessary.

If you find the following material of interest, you may insert it in one of your newsletters. You may even wish to put out a special newsletter. In either case, I believe it would be best not to identify me. Just mention that one of your readers sent in this material.

I will begin with an overview of the situation, then proceed with what has to be done, and end with an actual program which we can begin to implement immediately. I agree with you about the one thousand days the West has left - and that every month it's thirty days less. So here goes.

The Red Fascists who call themselves Communists, Socialists or "Liberals" have been waging war against the free and semi-free nations for over one hundred years. With victory of the Communists in the Soviet Union, they obtained a base of operation which is helping them in their war of subversion and military conquest. This war is a political warfare war. It is being waged against us by a political warfare army which is led by a

relatively small number of people who know exactly what is going on, plus a multitude of Pavlovian dogs who, upon key signals and key words, automatically know what is expected from them. For dozens of years, they have been conditioned to salivate each time the bell rings.

For a long time, the United States government has been urged to create a Freedom Academy in which to train our own agents of political warfare. There is a basic fallacy in this kind of approach. An academy operated by bureaucrats of the government cannot be expected to graduate students who will fight for free enterprise. An effective ideological response to Socialism and Communism would undermine the jobs of the bureaucrats. Even if the alternative to the ideological response is destruction, the bureaucrats would rather be destroyed than be revealed as unneeded parasites. (There are, of course, exceptions to the rule, and also there are plenty of government jobs which are legitimate. This refers to the functions of government which are necessary to protect persons against force, fraud, and external aggression. But, in the main, the above statement is true.) Therefore, if we are to create an effective academy, it must be operated and funded by private persons and private entities.

The Communists are not ten feet tall. They can and have been defeated quite often. They win their victories only with the help of their key friends in the West and their Pavlovian-dog followers. Let us examine this statement as it applies to a few important instances.

1. The Vietnam War: The West did not lose it on the battlefield. It was lost in the living rooms of the United States citizens who watched their televisions. It was lost in the high schools, universities, and churches. It was lost in Washington, D.C. If the United States had pursued World War II in the same manner as it had pursued the Vietnam War, General Rommel and General Guderian might have died laughing while their tanks quickly pulverized our forces. Our troops could not move into North Vietnam; shiploads of tanks, artillery, and other war materials arrived unopposed into North Vietnamese ports. (Often these weapons were carried in British vessels or in vessels from other Western allies.) A well-placed bomb from one fighter-bomber would have sunk a whole ship-load of tanks, but we waited until they were unloaded, then chased individual tanks with hoards of airplanes when they were vulnerable to SAM missiles. We were told about the difficulties of jungle warfare. Did not the United States win in Guadalcanal? How difficult would it have been for U.S. Marines to occupy Hanoi and Haiphong, then mop up at leisure?

When Nixon did the only sensible thing - chasing out the Vietcong from their Cambodian sanctuaries, how did the Communists and their Pavlovian-dogs react in the United States? What if the same kind of mob violence had resulted during World War II from U.S. action against Nazi Germany? What if
